The number of drug overdoses and overdose deaths are increasing for agencies of all sizes and locations. Patrol responses to drug overdose deaths are complex and time consuming and, as a result, requires additional patrol officer and patrol supervisor training and resources. Standardizing the patrol response to drug overdoses is an important step in the investigative process.

This 8-hour course is intended for patrol officers and patrol supervisors tasked with investigating drug overdoses and is also recommended for any patrol officer who is seeking a drug investigator or general investigator position. The course will cover essential topics in the two distinct phases of patrol drug overdose responses: First Responder Phase and Patrol Investigation Phase. Some of these topics include:

- Overview of the First Responder
- Report examples
- Patrol OD leads a/k/a Patrol homicide investigator
- Cell phone overview (identifying devices, password protection, airplane mode, safety issues, search warrants)
- · Social media overview
- Documenting and seizing evidence
- Video surveillance
- Scene interviews
- Target/source development

Including case review of patrol responses - bad to great.

Each attendee will receive the "Drug Overdose Patrol Response Guide" that will assist in ensuring that all necessary information is collected and reported to complete the patrol investigative response.
