This two-day course will provide law enforcement with the knowledge and tools needed to identify, understand, and more effectively investigate sexual assault cases.

The course will cover legal understandings, law enforcement's response in helping to understand trauma and how it can affect your victims and your investigation. It will also breakdown different investigative strategies and interviewing techniques based on the age and mental capacity of your victim, in addition to the importance of how to phrase questions and the use of an Advocate.

Other important topics covered include; obtaining DNA, identifying evidence to build a successful case, Victim Rights, and developing a Sexual Assault Response Checklist.

Guest speaker(s), subject to availability, will also present information on case preparation, charging, resources available and more.

Participants will gain experience in conducting interviews while building their knowledge and comfort regarding sexual assault investigations through case presentations and also in scenarios throughout the course.

Instructor:

Lt. Dawn Jones (RET): Was with the Milwaukee Police Department for over 25 years. While with the Milwaukee Police Department, Lt. Jones worked extensively with Domestic Violence Victims, Sexual Assault Victims, and Human Trafficking Victims. She was the supervisor of the Milwaukee Police Department Domestic Violence Unit and was a member of the Domestic Violence High-Risk Team (DVHRT). DVHRT is a multi-disciplinary team of advocates, law enforcement, prosecutors, and probation/parole agents that uses a risk assessment to identify high-risk cases of domestic violence. These cases are monitored and managed by the team to ensure that the high-risk offenders do not re-offend and that the victims are engaged in the proper services all to prevent future abuse and lethality.
