This course was developed for the experienced shooter in mind who wishes to transition or learn the benefits of the pistol mounted optic system.

This class covers the 22 tasks covered in the Wisconsin DOJ LESB Skills Competency Check List as they relate to the adaption of the Pistol Mounted Optic (PMO) and Pistol Mounted Optics Overview, Mounting and Zeroing, Optics Maintenance, Failure Response, Obscured Lens Response and training maintenance for continued success. The State's qualification course will also be completed at the end of the training.

Equipment List:

- Quality functional semi-automatic pistol with Reflex (red dot) sight
- 3 magazines (minimum) with mag pouches
- Belt mounted, dominant side holster that accepts a PMO pistol
- Clothing suitable for firearms training (including footwear suitable for rapid movement, sturdy belt, etc)
- Wraparound eyewear with polycarbonate lenses or non-shattering prescription
- Electronic hearing protection, earmuffs, or earplugs
- 400 rounds of ammunition
