This course will enable attendees to perform the critical tasks and roles to conduct professional criminal investigations. Students will learn to conduct effective interviews and interrogations, manage and analyze crime scenes, properly document investigative outcomes, write search warrants and subpoenas, understand how cellular and digital data can be an effective tool, how to benefit from social media/open sources, assist in the investigation of officer-involved shootings and deaths, work with informants, testify in court, maintain investigative ethics, and other critical topics.

It will include lecture, discussion, demonstration, and focused scenario-based instructions using actual and simulated investigations. The instructors will engage students to apply problem-solving processes and identify what steps they would take to challenge their perceptions, draw valid and reliable conclusions, and bring an investigation to a successful conclusion. Participants return to their departments with an understanding of their fundamental responsibilities from the crime scene to the court room as a professional investigator.

This course is recommended for new detectives/investigators or those who have not received formal training to conduct professional investigations. Investigative supervisors who have not received training are also encouraged to enroll.
