Who Should Attend?

This class is beneficial not only for Law Enforcement but also hospital personnel. There will be case studies applicable for nurses and MultiDiscipline Teams (MDT). Topics include:

What is Human Trafficking and Where is it Happening?

Instructors:

Lt. Dawn Jones (RET) was with the Milwaukee Police Department for over 25 years. While with MPD, Lt. Jones worked extensively with Domestic Violence Victims, Sexual Assault Victims, and Human Trafficking Victims. She was the supervisor of the Milwaukee Police Department Domestic Violence Unit and was a member of the Domestic Violence High-Risk Team (DVHRT). DVHRT is a multi-disciplinary team of advocates, law enforcement, prosecutors, and probation/parole agents that uses a risk assessment to identify high-risk cases of domestic violence. These cases are monitored and managed by the team to ensure that the high-risk offenders do not re-offend and that the victims are engaged in the proper services all to prevent future abuse and lethality.

Detective Gerardo Orozco has worked for the Milwaukee Police Department for 15+ years in multiple units and districts. Detective Orozco has worked for the Sensitive Crimes Division and was assigned to the Human Trafficking Task Force. He has investigated hundreds of trafficking cases, several of which have led to the arrest and successful prosecution of the traffickers. He is also a subject matter expert and has testified for the State of Wisconsin in human trafficking trials and has co-chaired and testified in several trafficking investigations throughout the State.
